

Bet365 hockey betting: the complete guide

Bet365 hockey betting 2026 — NHL moneylines, puck lines, totals, player props, live odds and promotions for Canadian bettors. Complete NHL guide.

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TL;DR Hockey is the centre of gravity for any Canadian sportsbook, and Bet365 treats it that way. Coverage spans the full NHL regular season, the playoffs and Stanley Cup futures, the seven Canadian franchises and international hockey, with deep market trees on every game. The core markets — moneyline, puck line and totals — are joined by an extensive player-prop catalogue, period markets and same-game Bet Builder combinations, while the in-play engine keeps hockey repricing through every shift. This guide covers Bet365's NHL coverage, the market types and how they work, how competitive the pricing is, the strengths of live hockey betting around power plays and goalie pulls, and the kinds of promotions Canadian bettors may see. It is an evaluation framework built on Bet365's official structure rather than a claim of hands-on testing, and offers and prices should be reconfirmed before betting.

NHL coverage

Bet365 covers every NHL regular-season game, the full playoffs and Stanley Cup futures, the seven Canadian clubs and international hockey, with deep market trees throughout.

For Canadian bettors hockey is not one sport among many; it is the main event. Bet365's coverage reflects that, with the NHL receiving the depth and attention it commands in the local market.

- **Regular season** — every game on the schedule is covered, with full market trees rather than just a headline moneyline. Whether it is a marquee Saturday-night matchup or a midweek game between non-contenders, the offering is consistent.
- **Playoffs** — coverage deepens for the postseason, with series prices, series-correct-score markets, advancement odds and round-by-round specials joining the per-game tree.
- **Stanley Cup futures** — outright winner, conference and division markets run through the season and update as the standings and playoff picture shift.
- **Canadian teams** — the Toronto Maple Leafs, Montréal Canadiens, Ottawa Senators, Winnipeg Jets, Calgary Flames, Edmonton Oilers and Vancouver Canucks all carry full market trees every game, which matters given how much Canadian betting volume concentrates on the home sides.
- **International and other hockey** — best-on-best international events, world championships and other leagues are covered where they run.

Single-game hockey betting has been legal across Canada since Bill C-218 amended the

Criminal Code in August 2021, removing the old parlay-only restriction. In Ontario, Bet365 operates as a licensed book at on.bet365.ca within the regulated market overseen by the AGCO and iGaming Ontario; outside Ontario the locally regulated option is the relevant provincial-lottery product.

Hockey gets the deepest treatment in the catalogue — every NHL game, the playoffs, Stanley Cup futures and all seven Canadian clubs with full market trees.

Market types

The hockey tree centres on the moneyline, puck line and totals, then extends into player props, period markets, team totals and same-game Bet Builder combinations.

Hockey has its own market vocabulary, and understanding the main types is the foundation of betting it well. The table below sets out the core NHL market types Bet365 offers and what each one means.

Market type	What it means	Typical use
Moneyline	A straight bet on which team wins the game (overtime/shootout included).	The simplest hockey market; back a side to win outright.
Puck line	A goal handicap, almost always set at 1.5 goals — the favourite must win by 2+, or the underdog must lose by 1 or win.	Better odds on a strong favourite, or insurance on an underdog.
Totals (over/under)	The combined goals by both teams over or under a set line, often 5.5 or 6.5.	Bet the game's pace and scoring rather than the winner.
Team totals	Goals scored by one specific team over or under a line.	Target a high-powered or shut-down side independently of the result.
Period markets	Result or totals for a single period (e.g. first-period winner).	Shorter-horizon bets and live-friendly markets.
Player props	Individual markets — anytime/first goalscorer, shots on goal, points, assists.	Express a view on a specific player's output.
Bet Builder	Combine several markets in one game into one priced bet.	Build a correlated angle, e.g. team to win and a star to score.
Futures	Long-term outrights — Stanley Cup, conference, division, awards.	Season-long positions and playoff bets.

A few notes for Canadian bettors:

- **The puck line is almost always 1.5** because hockey is low-scoring, so the alternate puck lines Bet365 offers (for example 2.5) are where you fine-tune risk and price.
- **Player props are the deepest part of the tree** and also carry the widest margins, so they reward specific research rather than broad coverage.
- **Bet Builder combinations** let you express a single correlated idea but price in the operator's margin on each leg.

Moneyline, puck line and totals are the backbone; player props, period markets, team totals and Bet Builder add the depth that rewards specific reads.

Hockey odds

Bet365 prices NHL mainlines competitively, generally in the tighter part of the indicative 5-7% band, though deep props are wider and line shopping still pays.

Hockey is one of the markets where Bet365's reputation for competitive pricing tends to hold up best, partly because NHL betting is high-volume and aggressively priced across the Ontario market.

Competitive margins. On NHL moneylines and puck lines the implied margin generally sits in the lower part of the indicative 5-7% band quoted for major events. To check it yourself, convert each side's decimal odds to an implied probability (1 divided by the odds), add them and subtract 100%. A moneyline priced around 1.90 / 1.90 implies roughly a 5.3% overround — sharp for a two-way market. Totals and team totals typically carry slightly more margin than the moneyline, and the deep player-prop tree carries the widest cushion of all.

Comparison with rivals. Against DraftKings and PointsBet, Bet365 is broadly competitive on hockey mainlines and frequently among the better prices, but no book is best on every line at every moment. The practical implication is unchanged by Bet365's strength here:

- **Default to Bet365 for NHL mainlines**, where its pricing is consistently strong.
- **Shop deep props**, where margins widen and rival books sometimes post a sharper individual number.
- **Hold more than one account** in the Ontario market and take the best available price on each bet.

Finding value. Value comes from your own probability estimate exceeding the price's implied figure after stripping margin, not from a low margin alone. Because NHL games hinge on small margins — a single bounce, a goalie's night, special-teams efficiency — the bettors who do best target specific situations they understand rather than betting every game. Odds, bonus and terms verified against Bet365's official pages in June 2026; these change, reconfirm before betting.

NHL mainlines are priced sharply, often in the lower 5-7% band, but props are wider — default to Bet365 for mainlines and shop the deep markets.

Live hockey betting

Hockey's momentum swings make it ideal for in-play: Bet365 keeps period, next-goal and updated markets live, with power plays and goalie pulls creating sharp pricing moments.

Few sports suit live betting as well as hockey. The game turns on bursts of momentum — a power play, a quick two goals, a goalie pulled for an extra attacker in the final minutes — and Bet365's in-play engine is built to reprice those swings fast.

Period-by-period and live markets. In-running hockey betting covers updated moneylines and puck lines, live totals, period winners and a set of in-play-only markets:

- **Next goal** — which team scores the next goal, a market that swings on every shift and is central to live hockey.

- **Period markets** — result and totals for the current or next period, useful for shorter-horizon reads.
- **Updated mainlines** — the moneyline, puck line and total recalculate continuously as the score and time remaining change.
- **Live player props** where offered, such as a named player to score next.

Live statistics. The live page carries shots, faceoff and power-play data plus a match tracker, letting you judge whether a team controlling play has had its price catch up yet. A side outshooting its opponent but still tied may offer value the current number does not reflect.

Key moments and strategy. The sharpest live opportunities cluster around clear turning points — the start of a power play, a momentum shift after a goal, and the late-game goalie pull when the trailing team gains an extra skater and totals and next-goal markets move sharply. Markets suspend briefly around goals and penalties while prices recalculate. Cash Out is widely available, letting you bank a lead before the final buzzer or cut a position that has turned. The discipline is the same as all in-play betting: react to genuine turning points with a clear read, not to every swing on screen, and set your odds-acceptance preference so fast movement does not reject your slip.

Hockey's momentum swings make it a top live sport; the sharpest moments cluster around power plays and the late goalie pull, with Cash Out to manage them.

Hockey promotions

Canadian bettors may see boosted NHL odds, parlay/Bet Builder offers and season-long features, but Ontario advertising rules restrict showing bonus details to eligible logged-in users.

Promotions can add value to hockey betting, but in Ontario they come with an important regulatory wrinkle and should be read on their own terms each time.

Typical promotion types. Across the market, hockey-relevant offers for existing customers commonly include:

- **Boosted odds (price boosts)** — selected NHL markets, often big games or popular player props, offered at enhanced prices for a limited window.
- **Parlay and Bet Builder offers** — promotions tied to multi-leg or same-game bets, such as a bonus on qualifying parlays or insurance if one leg lets you down.
- **Season-long features** — recurring promotions that run through the NHL calendar and into the playoffs, where competition and interest peak.
- **Event specials** — offers built around marquee dates and the postseason.

The Ontario advertising rule. AGCO standards restrict gambling inducements and bonus advertising to the general public, so operators typically show bonus and promotion details only to eligible, logged-in users rather than publishing amounts openly. That is why a precise figure or a specific current offer cannot responsibly be quoted here — the available promotions, their terms and their value change by period and are shown to eligible customers inside the account.

Reading the terms. Whatever the offer, judge it by its conditions: minimum odds, qualifying

market, maximum stake or return, opt-in requirement and expiry. A boosted price is only good value if the boosted number really beats the fair price after margin, and a parlay bonus only helps if you were going to place that bet anyway. Treat promotions as a marginal addition to a sound betting approach, not a reason to bet markets you would otherwise avoid, and check the current offers in your logged-in account before relying on any of them.

Expect boosted NHL prices, parlay/Bet Builder offers and season-long features, but Ontario rules mean details show only to eligible logged-in users — read each term.

What hockey markets does Bet365 offer on the NHL?

The core markets are the moneyline (straight winner), the puck line (a 1.5-goal handicap) and totals (combined goals over/under). These are joined by team totals, period markets, an extensive player-prop catalogue (anytime goalscorer, shots, points, assists), same-game Bet Builder combinations and Stanley Cup and division futures.

What is the puck line on Bet365?

The puck line is hockey's goal handicap, almost always set at 1.5 goals because hockey is low-scoring. The favourite must win by two or more goals to cover, while the underdog covers by losing by exactly one goal or winning outright. Bet365 also offers alternate puck lines to fine-tune risk and price.

Are Bet365's NHL odds competitive?

Yes, on mainlines. NHL moneylines and puck lines are generally priced in the lower part of the indicative 5-7% band, which is sharp for a two-way market. Deep player props carry wider margins, so the value advice is to default to Bet365 for mainlines and shop the deeper markets across more than one Ontario book.

Is live hockey betting good on Bet365?

Hockey suits in-play well because of its momentum swings. Bet365 keeps next-goal, period and updated mainline markets live and repricing fast, supported by live shot and power-play statistics. The sharpest moments cluster around power plays and the late-game goalie pull, with Cash Out available to bank or cut a position.

Does Bet365 run NHL promotions in Canada?

Canadian bettors may see boosted NHL odds, parlay and Bet Builder offers and season-long features. Because Ontario (AGCO) advertising rules restrict bonus promotion to the general public, the details are typically shown only to eligible, logged-in users, so check the current offers and their terms inside your account.

Can I bet single NHL games in Canada?

Yes. Single-game betting has been legal across Canada since Bill C-218 amended the Criminal Code in August 2021, ending the old parlay-only rule.
